

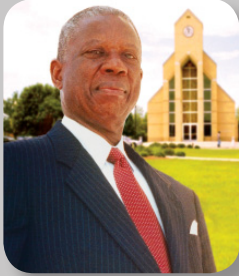

Wallace to Students: "Excellence is a Process"

Mr. Melvin Wallace, minority outreach advisor for the South Carolina Small Business Development Centers, spoke at the Business/FBLA Assembly on Thursday morning.

Wallace advised students to consider the process of excellence as they move to achieve success; indicating that it does not come quickly. "Excellence is a process." Wallace said, "Don't despise the process." He said it is unrealistic to expect success to be immediate. Supporting his point with scripture, Wallace quoted Zechariah 4:10, "Don't despise small beginnings."

As an executive, he has advised individuals from diverse professional backgrounds, nationally and internationally. Yet, he began small working for a collection agency at \$6.25 an hour. Reflecting, he said, "I am not supposed to be here. As a minority, looking at the numbers, I am not supposed to be here." Wallace shared that he has always been motivated to work harder than those around him in the workplace even though he often had less knowledge and experience. This work ethic involved commitment, drive and "working in a spirit of excellence." He added that he has always been motivated to find a better way of doing things.

Wallace suggested students utilize the principles of business to achieve excellence. He said an idea needs to be analyzed as it would be in a feasibility study. An individual needs to think about a decision and consider the resulting consequences before taking action. After doing so, gather feedback from individuals who have knowledge, take responsibility and move forward, striving for excellence.

In his closing, Wallace mentioned notable Morris College alumni and challenged students to add to this legacy.

Academic Dean Leroy Stagers gave closing remarks in the absence of President Luns C. Richardson. He applauded the student program participants for excellence in executing the program. On behalf of the president, he commended the faculty and staff of the Division of Business Administration, the Organizational Management Program and Phi Beta Lambda for a wonderful program and week of activities. He also thanked Mr. Wallace for an inspirational message. He recognized Mr. Jim Giffin, state director of the SC Small Business Centers and a former professor at the college. He cautioned students that the semester is coming to a close and encouraged them to implement excellence as they move forward.
