

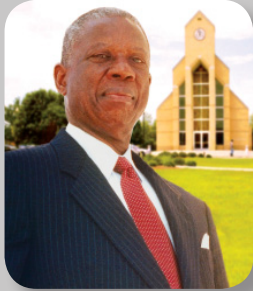

Fall Harvest Kick-off Rally Ignites Giving

The college held its annual Fall Harvest Kick-off Rally Assembly on Thursday morning in the Neal-Jones Auditorium.

Rev. Melvin Mack, director of Institutional Advancement and Church Relations, welcomed the campus community and explained that the assembly kicks-off the college's major fund-raising event, the Fall Harvest Rally. The rally meets the college's annual commitment to the United Negro College Fund, as a member institution. Mack challenged the campus community to show their love and appreciation to the college through pledges.

Dr. Leroy Staggers, academic dean of the college, gave the appeal to faculty and staff to "Help Lift the Veil of Darkness, as funding to support HBCUs, including Morris College makes a tremendous cultural and educational impact on changing the lives of black students as well as making a global impact." Staggers noted that the college's faculty and staff have a record of giving generously.

Rufugio Banuelos, SGA President, prompted the spirit of giving among the students as he made a strong appeal to the student body to demonstrate how much they value their education. As if sparked by a flame of gratitude and love, many spontaneous pledges were made by students.

President Luns C. Richardson transitioned the assembly to a close as he spoke of the "excellent spirit of giving" among the campus community, Morris College's significant history of giving and involvement with UNCF; including his leadership roles, and the significance of accreditation. Dr. Richardson marked his 40th year as president of the college with a pledge of \$20,000.

To date the pledges are as follows: Faculty/Staff, \$19,260; students, \$10,199.75; Dr. Richardson, \$20,000, for a total of \$49,459.
