

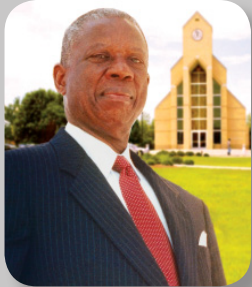

## **Jackson Delivers “Kingdom Living” News**

Dr. Charles B. Jackson, Sr. elevated the campus to a “new mindset” as he delivered the series, “Kingdom Living,” from Isaiah 65:17 during Religious Emphasis Week.

Jackson began the series on Tuesday morning, focusing on the theme, “Willing to grow, determined to succeed.” He explained that the first thing one must know to succeed is that, “The Kingdom of God is in you. It is not a realm but a reign.” Encouraging the campus community to implement maturity, faith and discipline he instructed, “As a kingdom citizen you must operate as such and raise your standard.” He clarified, “This kingdom living begins right now.”

On Wednesday, Jackson explained the “How to” of Kingdom Living. He said it begins with God making someone new but this newness must come with a different way of thinking. “A new you requires a new mindset. The scripture says, “As a man thinketh, so is he.”

On Thursday, Dr. Jackson shared additional insight with the campus community – the new mindset requires letting go of the past. Referencing Isaiah 65:17, he stated, “The former shall not be remembered when the new has come.” He explained that this is part of the divine shift which will include being given “favor for faithfulness.”

Referencing I Samuel 16, he warned “God cannot bless you with your David until you stop crying over Saul. Let go of complaints and worry. Forgive, let go and move on (Philippians 3.13).”

Friday’s closing message came with a promise of “Turnaround Time.” Speaking

again about the divine shift, Dr. Jackson referenced Mathew 19:20, “... the first shall be last and the last shall be first.” He said this change of “double for your trouble” will come with an eternal joy, reminding all that “Joy comes in the morning,” he encouraged the students to step into their “turnaround time.”

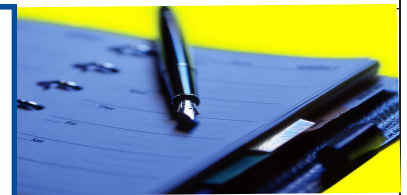
President Richardson gave the closing remarks. He commended Dr. Jackson for “doing a magnificent job this week” and stated, “I speak for the entire Morris College family when I say that you have been a blessing to us this week.” He encouraged the students to remember the message, “It is turnaround time.” He praised the chorale and the choir for their performances during the week and the college’s minister, Dr. Charles Pee and staff for their work on Religious Emphasis Week.

He also made the official public announcement of Dr. Jackson’s appointment as chairperson of the college’s board of trustees and paraphrased the scripture, stating, “In whom I am well pleased.”
