

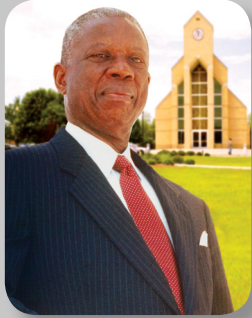

The Three A's: Aptitude, Attitude, and Altitude

Dr. Colclough delivers "grand address" during combined Founders' Day program for Sigma and Zeta

Last week, members of the Iota Zeta Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated held its annual Founders' Day assembly in collaboration with members of the Pi Theta Chapter of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated. The speaker was Reverend Dr. Franklin D. Colclough, Sr., Head of Staff and Stated Clerk for the New Harmony Presbytery.

A native of Clarendon County, Dr. Colclough is a graduate of Johnson C. Smith University. He is also a graduate of McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago, Illinois where he earned a Doctor of Ministry degree. His varied leadership roles include pastoral appointments, civic involvement, and dedicated membership in a number of organizations including the Delta Kappa Sigma Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. and the Sumter Regional Chapter of the Johnson C. Smith University Alumni Association.

As declared during remarks rendered by President Richardson, Dr. Colclough delivered "a grand address" for the occasion and "gave everyone a challenge to make good choices and do their best."

"In honor of this occasion, I want to share with you a word of hope, a word of challenge, and a word of encouragement," Dr. Colclough stated at the beginning of his address. As he continued with careful skill to verbally paint a clear picture of "strange land," he reminded the attentive audience of one of the world's most noted nursery rhymes, "Humpty Dumpty." In recalling the text, "Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall" and so on, he used the story to speak passionately about the need for each of us to "fix" ourselves first. "I believe the reason why we find ourselves in a strange land is because there are too many 'Humpty Dumpty' people trying to fix other 'Humpty Dumpty' lives. You can't help to fix someone else if you're all cracked up."

"As college students you are in the right place - the halls of academia," he declared as he encouraged the student-body to take advantage of preparing their minds and developing their potential for the challenges not only of today, but for the days ahead. "I encourage you to use this moment to prepare yourselves academically to be the best." He went on to share in great detail the importance of remembering and utilizing "the three A's: aptitude, attitude, and altitude." "If you have these three A's on your academic transcript, when you leave Morris College you can stand shoulder to shoulder with anyone!"

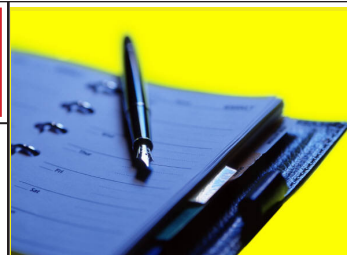
Samuel and Singleton Awarded 'Bankers' Scholarships

Two Morris College students, **Sylvia Samuel**, organizational management major; and **Jalisa M. Singleton**, business administration major, were among 19 students awarded scholarships by the South Carolina Bankers Association. The awarded scholarship amounts were \$3,000 and \$2,000, respectively. All students were interviewed by the Young Bankers Association Committee and selected based on their academic performance, leadership skills, and expressed interest or experience in banking or financial services as recipients of this year's awards.

In an effort to encourage and promote excellence in the field of banking and finance, the Young Bankers Division of the South Carolina Bankers Association provides annual scholarships to deserving South Carolina students pursuing a career in banking, finance and/or accounting.

Each year the Young Bankers Division raises funds to establish scholarships for deserving students enrolled in the school or department of business administration and who possess a strong interest in the financial industry. This year, through the Young Bankers Division Golf Tournament and the South Carolina Bankers School student raffle, the organization awarded \$35,750 in scholarship money to the 19 students.
