

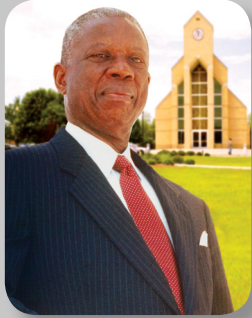

## **The Core Values: Education, Faith, and Service**

*Dr. Cleveland L. Sellers, Jr. shares the importance of core values and discipline with Morris College Family*

The campus community had an opportunity this week, during the college's Honors Convocation, to hear from "...one of the movers and shakers of our era" as described during an introduction of the speaker by President Richardson. Further described as one of South Carolina's "most outstanding young leaders and an outstanding civil rights leader," the speaker was Dr. Cleveland L. Sellers, Jr., President of Voorhees College in Denmark, SC.

Before becoming president of Voorhees College, Dr. Sellers, a distinguished educator, was director of the African-American Studies Program at the University of South Carolina. He also taught in the Department of History and the African-American Studies Program. A life-long Episcopalian, he is a warden at St. Philip's Episcopal Church in Denmark and has served on the board of the Episcopal Church Foundation.

"For many of you the transition and the transformation as it continues to evolve is getting you to wrap your minds, your heads, and your hearts around those concepts - education, faith, and service," he stated. Throughout his convocation address, Dr. Sellers continued to share the importance of embracing these core values (concepts) and undergirding them with discipline.

"I want you to understand that life will be filled with trials and tribulations and one of the things that you need to learn is how to navigate and negotiate. When obstacles knock you down, don't wallow in the pity and the sorrow - get yourself up, dust yourself off, and move yourself on," he declared. He went on to discuss in great depth each core value and issued a challenge to each student to commit themselves to move forward. In making the connection for applying the core values he said, "...being here (at Morris College) is important in terms of your future."

As he concluded, Dr. Sellers shared how determination, focus, and the ability to accept constructive criticism are equally pivotal to everyone's growth, development, and ultimate levels of success.

In addition to the convocation address, students who academically excelled during the 2010 spring semester were recognized. President Richardson praised the honor students for their achievements, but expressed to the student-body that, "...if you've done your very best, then you all are honor students."
