

Fall Harvest Kick-Off Rally Ignites Campus Community

Yesterday's assembly was the official kick-off of the 2011 Fall Harvest Rally.

Director of Institutional Advancement and Church Relations, Rev. Melvin Mack, opened the rally stating, "Our purpose here today is to hear your commitment, your excitement, and your love for this great institution of higher learning." He explained that the pledges given at the rally will be used to fulfill the college's obligation to UNCF's Annual Campaign Drive.

This year's UNCF goal is \$35,000. Rev. Mack charged, "I challenge you to let your appreciation for Morris College shine through in this great effort."

The Director of the Learning Resources Center and an instructor in the Division of Education, Mrs. Janet Clayton, challenged faculty and staff to remember, "To whom much is given much is required." She reflected on the sacrifices of the college's founders and expressed that they are fortunate to be rewarded for their time and talent at Morris College, while many other institutions are suffering the impact of the economy. She attributed the college's strong financial standing to President Richardson's financial fortitude and gave an impassioned chal-

lenge to faculty and staff to give back and show their appreciation.

SGA President, Kennard Jones challenged the student community, stating, "It is through giving that we are able to be a blessing".

President Richardson, during his closing remarks, pledged \$15,000. He applauded the students on their excellent turnout for the rally and their outpouring of financial support.

President Richardson currently serves on the governing board for UNCF. This includes appointments to the Presidents' Board and the Corporate Board where he is a member of the audit committee.

The Kick-Off Rally resulted in \$47,636 in pledges. Faculty and staff pledged \$32,035 and students pledged \$15,601. Of the total pledges, \$4,416 has been received.

As a UNCF member institution, the college benefits from UNCF resources and scholar-ships that enable the college to keep tuition affordable.

Monies received from pledges will be announced during the Pre-Fall Harvest Worship and Rally on Tuesday, November 15, 2011 at 10:00 a.m. in the Neal-Jones Auditorium.
