

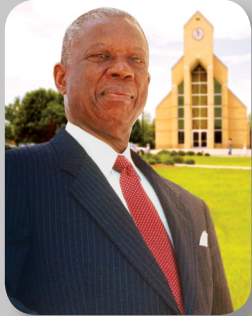

Cokley Shares his Vision for “ Making a Difference Where it Counts”

Rev. De' Angelo Cokley, vice-president of the senior class and native of Columbia, SC, gave a clear vision of the Senior Class Assembly theme, “Making a Difference Where it Counts” in his speech Thursday morning.

Explaining to students that they currently have the power to make a difference in the lives of others, he stated, “Today I am encouraging you to be aware that your inner power has the potential to become a ripple effect. We need you to share your intelligence, imagination, talents, and enthusiasm, right where we are, right now.”

“Get off the stool of mediocrity”, he charged them. Your attitude will determine your altitude.”

Cokley said, “Every student under my voice has the potential to do enormous things.” He later followed with his favorite scripture, Philippians 4: 13,

(KJ) , I can do all things through Christ Jesus, which strengtheneth me.

Keenly aware that students will face challenges and opposition on their journey to success and making a difference, he enlightened them that great success comes from obstacles that have been overcome. He shared basketball star Michael Jordan’s initial failure to make the high school basketball team, evolving to a career as a world renowned athlete. Cokley shared, it’s about perseverance, “It is not where you start. It is where you finish.”

Cokley called for the students to turn their criticism of others and the world into constructive pursuits by stepping forward and responding to a need. “If something is broke, show us how to fix it. If something works, show us how to make it better”, he instructed them. Encouraging the campus community to apply themselves in all worthwhile endeavors, he stated, “You will be remembered for the difference you make. “
