

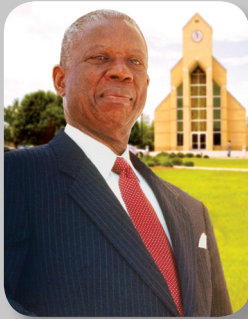

## **Earl Cautions "Know What to Rejoice About"**

Dr. Riggins Earl, Jr., professor of Ethics and Theology at the Interdenominational Center in Atlanta, delivered an eye-opening message at the Mid-Winter Banquet on last Friday evening; cautioning attendees to, "Know What to Rejoice About."

Dr. Earl took his message from Luke 10: 17-20. He shared how the disciples came back with a report of accomplishment, rejoicing because they were able to cast out demons in Jesus' name. Jesus responded to them not to rejoice in that but to rejoice in the fact that their names are written in heaven. Earl added, "They got carried away with the use of his name, rather than his name using them."

Describing how we often view success inappropriately by getting excited about the amount of money in the bank and obtaining mega-church status, Earl explained that we need another perspective about success. "We need to view the whole picture and realize the real reason to rejoice is that our name is written in the Lamb's Book of Life." He added, "Move from tunnel vision and getting excited about temporal gains and measure; look for success by eternal gains."

Earl went on to elaborate that this new perspective should change ministry. "Be sober in your rejoicing. 'Pseudo Religion' is about feeling good. All ministry does not feel good-it is work."

He also urged believers to move from fear to faith, "Set goals by faith, not by fear. Where fear sets precedence over faith, you can't do the will of God. God calls us to walk by faith and not by sight," (II Corinthians 5.7). Concluding his message he stated, "The mission of God is not pseudo joy. The joy comes from being obedient. He asked, "What will be your report?"

Dr. Richardson, as host president, gave the greetings and college update.

A total of \$63,360 was raised during the rally. From July 1, 2011 to February 24, 2012, a total of \$870,795.80 has been raised from private sources.

## Study Abroad Program Heads to South Africa

As a part of the Morris College Study Abroad Program, thirteen students and four professors will travel to the "Rainbow Nation" of South Africa from March 2 to March 11, 2012. After a stop in Frankfurt, Germany, the group will travel to Johannesburg, the financial and commercial center of South Africa. In Johannesburg students will visit the Apartheid Museum and tour Soweto, (Southwest Township), a pacesetter for music, language and politics.

Students will examine the economic development and resource management of the city, study artistic endeavors, including the Market Theatre Complex, and explore issues of migration, urbanization, and cultural diversity in a historical context.

Before flying from Johannesburg to Capetown, the southern tip of Africa, students will travel to Kruger National Park, the oldest and largest game reserve in the world, to observe the unique ecosystem and the many species of African animals.

The trip will enhance the studies of students currently enrolled in International Business, Introduction to Theatre and Cultural Geography.

Traveling with the group from the city are alumnae Sarah Nelson and Willie Mae Holland and local photographer, Charlie Mathis.
