



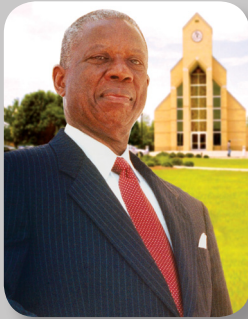

## **Sarvis and Randolph Promote Civic Involvement**



Dr. Natalie Sarvis, assistant principal at Sumter High School and member of the Sumter Alumni Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.,

gave an inspiring address at the Delta's Founders' Day Program on Tuesday evening.

Sarvis expressed a value of education, her journey to obtaining a doctorate degree and advice to students pursuing education.

She advised essential elements for students in pursuing education: know that you will face challenges, maintain a positive attitude, act with integrity, treat others as you want to be treated, be true to your passion, dream big dreams and take risks.

Sarvis elaborated that when one is true to one's passion; the opportunities will come. She said, "Passion sustained gives energy to excel." Sarvis advised listening to one's inner voice and ignoring "the noise of others."

She shared, "Life is about citizenship and contributing to improve the lives of others." Finally she said, "Know that you are loved and there is something special about each of you."

Mrs. Janet Clayton, director of the Learning Resources Center, gave remarks in the absence of President Richardson. She thanked Sarvis for her challenge and Xi Rho Chapter for presenting a wonderful program.



Dr. Lonnie Randolph, Jr., president of the South Carolina NAACP, presented a commanding message on Thursday morning at the MCM I Assembly.

Randolph took the campus community through history as he reflected on, "Where we were, where we are, and where we can go today." He presented sharp contrasts and comparisons of the actions of former political leaders of yesteryear with those of today, sharing how the NAACP began in 1909 in response to some of those actions.

He reminded us that advocacy and civic engagement is still needed today. He alerted, "Mediocrity in civic engagement usually parallels classroom performance."

He asked, "Where are we today in South Carolina?" He said, "The battle is not over." His question came with a charge for the campus to be civically minded and civically engaged "to make life better for all people. "To improve the life of others will improve your life as well."

Dr. Richardson closed the assembly stating, "Dr. Randolph is an undisputed leader of human rights and advancement in South Carolina and in the nation." He commended the MCM I Program for a job well done.

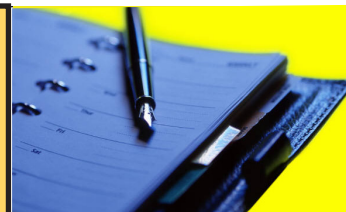
